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Project Neptune Submersible



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• Imagine this: You're cruising at a depth of about 50 feet beneath the surface of a pure blue sea—so blue it almost feels electrified, powered by the sunlight above—in a submersible that turns and torques with the long, graceful arcs of a supercar. Sounds like sci-fi fantasy, right?

Yet thanks to Triton, the Sebastian, Florida-based submarine specialists, and Aston Martin, the British premium automotive experts, the dream becomes an over-the-top reality. The two entities have paired up to conceive Project Neptune, the world's foremost "luxury submersible" that blends the precision of the former's nautical prowess with the performance of the latter's top-tier cars. The result is something that looks otherworldly—and, frankly, downright cool.

Project Neptune carries one pilot and two passengers, and can descend to 1,640 feet. That's insanely

deep for a consumer submarine. It also has eight hours of power, and can be customized in jazzy Aston Martin colors such as Zaffre Blue, Quantum Silver or Diavolo Red.

But what really makes this watercraft the talk of the marina is its harmonization of surf and racing-strip properties. The submersible's exterior iridium-coated protective canopy retains

sleek, aquadynamic lines, while the interior features carlike metal details and even luxe leather seats (Project Neptune's overall impression is closely tied to Aston Martin's Valkyrie hypercar).

Think of it, then, as the ultimate seafaring summertime toy. But be warned: You'll need about \$4 million to secure one.
