## A Bright, Bejeweled Piano Inspired by Jennifer Hudson Is Being Auctioned for Charity

In honor of her new film *Respect*, Steinway & Sons and MGM Studios commissioned a custom piano painted by muralist duo MenaceResa

Jennifer Hudson might be best known for her work in the music and film industries, but the Julian D. King Gift Foundation she and her sister Julia founded keeps her plenty busy too. This past week <a href="her film Respect">her film Respect</a>, the biopic in which she portrays Aretha Franklin, was released and to coincide with this, renowned <a href="piano">piano</a> company Steinway & Sons and MGM Studios, which produced the film, are auctioning off a custom piano to benefit the Julian D. King Gift Foundation.

The Boston upright piano was painted by the New York muralist duo MenaceResa, who are known for their ability to seamlessly meld the fine art and graffiti worlds in their work, and who were chosen by Hudson for the project. "The design for this piano is based on all of Jennifer's favorite things," the duo said, finishing each other's sentences in a video about the making of the piano. "She likes purple, a range of bright colors, and she really likes gems. Things that really shimmer and shine." The bejewelled piano certainly catches the eye, its vibrant appearance perfect for any musician who's dissatisfied with the subtlety of a classic black piano.
